#### **MFP Program Overview**

In 2007, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) awarded funds for 46 states to start *Money Follows the Person* demonstration grant programs (MFP)

• 36 states and districts have active MFP programs

O In 2022, 5 additional states and territories were awarded MFP Grants from CMS



## **MFP Program Overview**

MFP Goals:

- Increase the use of home and community-based services (HCBS) and reduce the use of institutionally-based services
- C Eliminate barriers in state law, state Medicaid plans, and state budgets that restrict the use of Medicaid funds to enable Medicaid-eligible individuals to receive support for appropriate and necessary longterm services and supports in the settings of their choice
- O Strengthen the ability of Medicaid programs to provide HCBS to people who choose to transition out of institutions
- O Put procedures in place to provide quality assurance and improve HCBS

- In 2007, Kentucky Transitions was created to administer the MFP program in Kentucky
- O Designed to assist Medicaid members who are currently residing in nursing homes to transition back into the community
- Since 2008, Kentucky Transitions has moved over 800 individuals from institutional facilities to community setting
- O Participants moved to residences in 103 of the 120 counties in Kentucky

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To align with the Home Community-Based Waivers, *Kentucky Transitions* targets the following populations:

Physically disabled
Elderly
Acquired Brain Injuries
Persons with a primary diagnosis of Mental Illness



Pre-Transitions funds *Kentucky Transitions* can cover:

- O Housing Security Deposit includes first month's rent
- O Household set up include furnishings, bedding, linens and dishes
- Kitchen set up, laundry and cleaning supplies along with necessities
- G Food stock sufficient for sustenance until individual can set up SNAP and receive Social Security check
- O Durable medical equipment with a physician's order
- O Pre-Transition transportation
- O Pest eradication



## **Kentucky Transitions Housing**

O Helps participants find affordable, accessible, and safe housing options

Assists participants complete housing applications and leasing agreements

Complete Housing Quality Standards Inspection on nonsubsidized housing units



#### **Housing Initiatives**

Address challenges in locating and securing affordable and accessible housing

Collect and share innovative and effective housing strategies

O Build and strengthen partnerships between MFP programs and housing entities and maintaining partnerships
